Call to Worship: Psalm 17

¹ I love you, O Lord, my strength.² The Lord is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold.

People:

³I call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised, and I am saved from my enemies.

Leader:

⁴The cords of death encompassed me; the torrents of destruction assailed me; ⁵the cords of Sheol entangled me; the snares of death confronted me.

People:


People:

In Scripture, the call to worship comes from God. We need to be called because it is not our natural response to come to God. God takes the initiative, moves towards us with grace, and invites us to worship Him.



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Prayer of Adoration

BE SEATED

John 15:1-11 (ESV)

¹ "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. ² Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. ³ Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴ Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. ⁵ I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If anyone does not abide in me, he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷ If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. 8 By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples. ⁹ As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. 11 These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.



PLEASE STAND

Heidelberg Catechism, Question and Answer 1

Leader:

Christian, What is your only comfort in life and in death?

People:

We unite our voices with believers across time and place, to confess the essentials of our faith.

That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ. He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has delivered me from the tyranny of the devil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven; in fact, all things must work together for my salvation. Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, also assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.

BE SEATED

The Lord's Supper

The pastor begins with words of introduction, followed by the Fencing of the Table, reminding the congregation who is invited to partake and who should refrain. He then offers a prayer of consecration for the bread and the wine, sets forth the Words of Institution from Scripture, and proceeds to distribute the consecrated elements of bread and wine to the congregation.

Distribution of the Bread

Let us wait until all have received the bread, that we may partake together, remembering the body of our Lord given for us.

Distribution of the Cup

Let us wait until all have received the cup, that we may drink together as one body in Christ.
